Recommended Activities

- 1. *Document any invasive weeds present on your property, including blackberry, holly, ivy, and others. Using the examples as a guide, write up management recommendations for controlling these weeds, focusing on integrated pest management, which means considering multiple control options (mechanical, cultural, chemical). Include this information in the invasive weeds subsection of the forest health/wildfire/invasive species section of your plan.
- 2. *Draft the Property Access/Roads and Trails (Resource Category V) and Aesthetics and Recreation (Resource Category VIII) sections of your plan. Use the examples for guidance.
- 3. If you want to include it in your plan, draft the optional Specialized Forest Products section (Resource Category IX). Use the examples for guidance.
- 4. If fire risk is an issue on your property, consider adding some mitigation activities to the forest health section of your plan.
- 5. *E-mail a finished draft of your plan to your site visit forester for review.
